
Hello Everyone,

Facebook is leaving clues about a possible cryptocurrency launch

London (CNN Business) Facebook is reportedly preparing to launch a cryptocurrency as part of its global push into payments.

The BBC reported Friday that Facebook wants to start testing "GlobalCoin" by the end of this year. The Financial Times said the company had even held talks with the Winklevoss twins, founders of crypto exchange Gemini, who have sued Mark Zuckerberg for allegedly stealing their idea for a social network.

Facebook (<u>FB</u>) refused to comment on the reports, but told CNN Business it is exploring ways to make use of blockchain technology.

And there's mounting evidence that it could soon break into the crypto scene.

It has invested in a blockchain company and hired more experts to develop payments on its WhatsApp messaging platform. It has also caught the attention of lawmakers.

Scotland: New modified design unveiled for £20 polymer banknote

The Bank of Scotland has unveiled (7th November) the modified design which will be included on their latest £20 banknote. In keeping with the specifications of circulation banknotes, which are taken from Bank of England banknotes, the new £20 banknotes will be printed on polymer and will also be reduced in their dimensions. The back design of the Bank of Scotland's latest £20 note will continue to feature the Forth Bridge. The distinctive red Forth Bridge, a cantilever railway bridge crossing the Firth of Forth which is located nine miles west of the city of Edinburgh, was listed as a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in July 2015. Considered one of the finest symbols of industrial Scotland, it was designed by the English engineers Sir John Fowler and Sir Benjamin Baker, with construction commencing in 1882. The Forth Bridge has a length of 8,094 feet (2467 metres) and double tracks elevated to 150 feet (45.72) metres above the water level at high tide. The face side includes the date 1st June 2019 and also continues to feature prominent Scottish novelist and poet Sir Walter Scott (1771–1832). Remembered as a Scottish historical novelist, poet, playwright, and historian, many of his works remain classics of both English-language literature and Scottish literature. Alongside Scott's image is the image of the Mound, a man-made slope in central Edinburgh which connects Edinburgh's New and Old Towns. The building depicted is the elegant domed headquarters of the Bank of Scotland, located on the Mound. The size of the new banknote will measure at 139 by 73 millimetres and includes updated security features incorporated into the note and as part of the transition from paper to polymer. One of the new security features is the anti-counterfeit "window effect" which can be found in the windows of the Mound. An image of the bank's headquarters is visible on both sides, allowing the windows to be perfectly aligned and see-through. The 20-pound polymer banknotes include a holographic elongated vertical window with a northern lights effect shown towards the top when tilted. Additionally, the clouds adjacent to the allegorical statue will move left to right when tilted east to west. Bank of England announced the £20 polymer banknotes would be released on the 20th February 2020

Bitcoin's surges past \$10,000 the first time in a year

New York (CNN Business)Boosted by a weaker dollar and fresh enthusiasm for cryptocurrencies, bitcoin surged past \$10,000 for the first time in a year. The cryptocurrency is known for its volatile price swings. Between late 2016 and 2018, investors watched as bitcoin soared from just a few hundred dollars to more than \$20,000, before plunging back down.

Then, late Friday, it reached the \$10,000 mark for the first time in over a year, according to Coinbase. Bitcoin owes its latest ascension to a weaker dollar and Facebook's new digital currency, Libra.

Digital currencies also got a nod this week from Fed Chairman Jerome Powell and Bank of England Governor Mark Carney, who indicated that central banks should look at bitcoin and other crytpocurencies with an open mind.



That could mean further regulation down the road, which would likely lead to reduced volatility for bitcoin and more legitimacy in global financial Libra will expose 2 billion Facebook users to crypto. As cryptocurrency becomes more mainstream, more people may start to use it as an actual method of payment instead of treating it like a short-term trading opportunity for get rich quick investors. But if Libra catches on, that could actually hurt bitcoin instead of helping it. Consumers may prefer a so-called stable coin like Libra instead of bitcoin and other cryptocurrencies that have been subject to dramatic swings in price. Some worry that the dramatic spike in bitcoin, which has now surged nearly 170% from just under \$3,700 at the end of 2018, will ultimately scare away long-term investors.

"The appeal of bitcoin is still too limited for the average investor. It's very risky and the volatility has been extreme," said Paul Markham, global equity portfolio manager at Newton Investment Management.

The 2019 American Silver Eagle one-ounce Enhanced Reverse Proof coin will also be available at the Mint's sales centers in Washington, D.C.; Philadelphia; and Denver. Availability may be limited and subject to .Each coin is encapsulated and packaged in a blue velvet, satin-lined presentation case, placed in a classic blue outer box. For the first time, the Mint has numbered the certificate of authenticity that accompanies each coin. The number on each Certificate of Authenticity does not reflect the order in which each coin

was minted. Production of this coin is limited to 30,000 units. Orders will be limited to one per household indefinitely.
